You are going to set up a webpage to help you collect the sponsorship money. The webpage will make it easy for people to give £5, £10, £20 or £50 donations that will go directly to your chosen charity.

You decide to write an email to request sponsors for your charity run.

**Q1.** Write an email to your family and friends telling them about the 10km run and asking them to sponsor you.

Consider including:

- reasons why you are participating in the fun run
- why you think it is important to raise funds for the charity that you are supporting
- details about how people can donate to the webpage
- any other information that you think might be important

You should structure and format your work appropriately.

You should aim to write about 300 words.
