Registering Learners

Once you are ready to deliver this qualification, you will need to register your learners in line with the timescales below:

Short courses (15 weeks or less) within 25 working days of the course start date. Full year long courses (over 15 weeks) within 60 working days of the course start date.

Quality Assurance and Standardisation
