Access to HE



The Open Awards Level 3 Access to HE (Higher Education) Diploma is a life-changing qualification specifically designed for adult learners, as an alternative route to A-Levels onto university degree courses.

The Diploma is composed of a number of units with a level and credit value. Students must achieve 60 credits in total. 15 of the credits are from ungraded units and 45 are graded and are awarded at Pass, Merit or Distinction. On average it takes a year to complete, though some courses work on different timescales.

Like A-Levels, the Diploma is a full Level 3 qualification, available in a wide range of subjects, that is accepted by most universities and other HEIs, to meet their course entry requirements. HEIs work with us on the development of the content for our Diplomas, to ensure they provide a sound basis on which to progress onto a degree course. The Diploma is regulated by the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA), to ensure it meets rigorous quality requirements.

The providers we work with set entry requirements to their Diploma courses that make sure that individuals are ready for the demands of the course and are able to fulfil the requirements for progression onto their intended degree course. For example, a GCSE C, or above, in English, Maths and Science for primary school teaching.

Perhaps more than any other qualification, the Access to HE Diploma has the power to change lives.


Admissions Fair



We have been working on an exciting project through the Department for Education's Flexible Learning Fund, to bring our learners **new** Blended Learning materials for our Access to HE Diplomas in Health Pathway, including development units.



Blended Learning is where online learning is blended with classroom based learning. The aim of Open Awards' blended learning materials is to provide the online content part of this blend.





The Blended Learning team are able to convert your offline content or workbooks into digitalised interactive versions, whilst working to support tutors to ensure that they are comfortable with this delivery approach.





We have a total of 47 units in development in the following areas: Biology; Psychology; Criminology; Health Studies; Sport and Exercise; Sociology.


