The Access to Higher Education Diploma is a qualification which prepares people without traditional qualifications for study at university.

Access to HE Diplomas are delivered by a wide range of colleges in England and Wales, and are available in a range of different subjects such as Nursing, Humanities, Law, and Psychology.

Enrolling on an Access course as a young learner (16-18)

Access to HE Diploma qualifications are designed specifically for adult learners that provide a pathway to university study when individuals don't have the necessary qualifications for entry.

There is however, no formal restriction on course enrolment for 16-18year-olds, but it is accepted that a course such as the Access to HE Diploma may be the most suitable course for a particular individual.

Enrolling on an Access course as a young learner (16-18)

Enrolment on to an Access to HE Diploma as a young learner would be down to the professional judgement of the staff making admissions decisions at providers. It is expected that, on a case-by-case basis, if staff are confident that a Diploma is the best and most suitable option for an individual, enrolment would be permitted.
