

## Experienced Worker Assessment (EWA)

The Experienced Worker Assessment (EWA) is the assessment process to recognise occupational competence for people who have been working in a relevant industry role, normally for over five (5) years, but haven't been able to complete an equivalent Level 3 vocational qualification.

The Experienced Worker Assessment is based on the qualification requirements as defined in accordance with the associated ECS Card, so that both new entrants and existing workers are now being assessed and accredited against the same industry standard.

The assessment has been approved by the Joint Industry Board and ECS.
