
Purpose Statement

The primary purpose of this qualification is to support you to develop knowledge and/or skills relevant to a particular specialisation within an occupation or set of occupations. This qualification will support you to develop knowledge around being a Mentor and to apply that knowledge within your own setting.



Who is it for?

- Learners who want to take on additional roles/responsibilities as a Mentor

What does this qualification cover?

To achieve the Certificate, you are required to achieve 14 credits and commit to around 140 hours of learning.

You will need to complete 3 mandatory units:

- Barriers to learning
- Supporting Children and Young People
- Planning and implementing an intervention

You then have a choice of 6 specific pathways to allow the qualification to be tailored to the specific setting you are working in:

- Sport
- Business
- Workplace
- Life Mentoring
- Youth
- Apprenticeship


This unit will appear on your unit transcript that accompanies your qualification certificate to demonstrate your area of specialism.



What are the Entry Requirements?

There are no specific entry requirements. Due to the level of the qualification and the evidence requirements, a level 2 English qualification (or equivalent demonstrable skills) would be advantageous.
