#### **Becoming a Provider**

#### **Registering Learners**

Once you are ready to deliver this qualification, you will need to register your learners in line with the timescales below:

You will need to register your learners via the Open Awards portal.

#### **Quality Assurance and Standardisation**

#### **Provider Staff Requirements**

It is expected that Providers will have occupationally competent staff with relevant subject knowledge and/or sector experience for their role in the delivery of the units/qualifications being offered.

This qualification would benefit from tutor experience in the industry but there is considerable unit content that does not necessarily require industry knowledge. Knowledge of CRRU code, use of chemicals would allow the tutor to bring the subject to life with practical examples, but this is not essential.

Providers are responsible for ensuring that their staff are occupationally competent and have access to appropriate training and support. They are also responsible for notifying Open Awards of staff changes.

#### **Assessment**

As this is a specialist qualification, Providers will require pre-approval to deliver and assess from the Open Awards Quality Assurance Team.

It is advisable that providers use their own devised Multiple Choice / True and false assessment either online or paper based. The assessment must cover all learning outcomes and assessment criteria and undergo pre-verification by an Open Awards Quality Assurance Team member before commencing the first assessments.

Assessment practices must reflect the <u>Equality and Diversity Policy of Open</u> <u>Awards</u>.

#### Training and support

**Please note:** There is no need for a specialist EQA, nor specialist equipment to teach the course.

#### **Standardisation**
