

# Open Awards Level 3 End-point Assessment for ST0958 Community Health and Wellbeing Worker

## Entry Requirements

There are no formal entry requirements.

## Mandatory Qualifications

To satisfy gateway requirements, apprentices without level 2 English and maths will need to achieve this level prior to taking the End-point Assessment. For those with an education, health and care plan or a legacy statement, the apprenticeship's English and maths minimum requirement is Entry Level 3. A British Sign Language (BSL) qualification is an alternative to the English qualification for those whose primary language is BSL.

Apprentices will also submit a portfolio of evidence at gateway.

## Role Profile

Community Health and Wellbeing Workers are a rapidly expanding workforce supporting the increasing emphasis across government departments on improving the health of local people and communities by preventing poor health and tackling inequalities. Their work is informed by the wider social determinants of health, such as the social, cultural, political, economic, commercial and environmental factors that shape the conditions in which people are born, grow, live, work and age.

Community Health and Wellbeing Workers work in partnership with individuals and their communities to identify and address health and wellbeing needs, improve health, prevent ill-health and reduce inequalities.

## On-programme Stage

During this stage the apprentice is employed within the health and community sector (including a range of agencies such as the NHS, local government, voluntary, community and third sector organisations). They will complete both on-the-job and off-the-job training and learning, which should enable them to develop the knowledge, skills and behaviours set out within the apprenticeship standard. They will also complete training towards their English and maths (as appropriate) and compile a portfolio of evidence to be submitted at gateway.

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### Completion and Certification

Open Awards will issue a summary of results following successful completion of all End-point Assessment (EPA) requirements. Open Awards will also request the apprenticeship completion certificate on behalf of an apprentice once they have completed their apprenticeship.

### How Will the Learner Be Assessed?

This standard has three assessment methods:

1. Multiple choice test  
(30 questions, 45 minutes)
2. Demonstration of practice  
(100 minutes +/- 10%)
3. Professional discussion underpinned by a portfolio of evidence  
(60 minutes +10%)

The EPA should typically be completed within a 3 month period.

### Progression

Apprentices who successfully achieve this apprenticeship could progress into employment in a range of roles including: Care or Service Navigator, Community Connector, Community Health Champion, Health Trainer, Live Well Coach, Social Prescribing Link Worker.
