Indicative Content

LO1	Learners, through the production of a Journal Quilt, will demonstrate the accuracy of straight seams, appropriate length of stitch and that loose ends are not visible. They should critically compare their work with previously produced quilts.
LO2	Learners should, through the production of a Journal Quilt, produce seam work that is accurate and within $\frac{1}{8}$ " of tolerance. Seams should be matched accurately, and pressed appropriately. In addition, there should be evidence that all points are sharp.
LO3	Through the Journal Quilt, learners should demonstrate different blocks that are appropriate for the overall finish of the quilt. The Journal Quilt should also have a cohesive design with quilting which showcases the blocks.
