Indicative Content

LO1	Learners should be building on their knowledge and experience of precise and efficient piecing. They should be able to demonstrate a wide variety of complex piecing, for instance, Seminole piecing through to accurate sewing of 'Y' seams
LO2	Learners will be able to analyse blocks in existing quilts and understand how they were put together. They should demonstrate a variety of complex piecing in the workshop samples and their Journal Quilt. As a consequence of planning and pressing the seams efficiently all piecing should lie completely flat.
LO3	The learner should demonstrate the learning of previous units and produce a design which is impactful and pleasing, but which employs complex piecing methods. The piecing should be accurate, with sharp points and matching seams. The learner should include an explanation in their personal journal as to why they chose their particular design.
