Indicative Content	
LO1	<p>1.1 The Learner is required to explain their own organisations understanding of sustainability both corporately and for procurement. This could include website references, missions and values etc.</p> <p>1.2 The Learner is required to identify policies and procedures that comply with current legislations and/or regulation regarding sustainability. In the absence of direct sustainable policies and procedures learners may need to link or refer to a variety of policies and procedures that support sustainability.</p> <p>1.3 Projects: These can be historic, or current, with the Learner being required to identify what was done and why, with any added benefits for efficiency, business profile, health and safety, wellbeing, etc.</p> <p>1.4 The Learner is required to comment on how projects are monitored and give examples of monitoring tools that their organisation uses in this process.</p>
LO2	<p>2.1 The Learner is required to source documentary evidence and processes which support a commitment to ethical working practices, commenting on how these commitments contribute positively to the organisation. Examples may include Core Values statement, “Functional Economy” commitments, Accreditation and Memberships, Accident Records, Conflict of Interest Declarations, Confidentiality and Diversity Policies, evidence of Ethical Decision Making, Reporting Processes, etc.</p> <p>2.2 The Learner is required to reflect on the evidence produced in 2.1. The Learner should be able to identify monitoring practices and draw conclusions from data generated in monitoring and/or impact activity.</p> <p>2.3 The Learner is required to identify what might represent a Conflict of Interest in their organisation, as well as comment on the organisational processes and procedures in place to manage any Conflicts of Interest.</p>
LO3	<p>3.1 The Learner is required to signpost or refer to previously presented documents to demonstrate that they identify the “three pillars” of CSR including cultural considerations. There may be an organisational statement, or pledges, memberships of associations or awards/accreditations that demonstrate responsiveness of the organisation to economic, social and environmental impacts of its operations.</p> <p>3.2 The Learner is required to include their own organisation performance measurements through performance indicators, audits, data, reports, etc.</p> <p>3.3 The Learner is required to present their improvement idea through a variety of channels. These channels could be an official notification/presentation to line</p>

	<p>manager, participation in working groups. They should include the idea and explain how it will improve CSR with their own organisation.</p> <p>(NB. Resulting evidence of verbal answers and professional discussion, etc. needs to be made available for IQA/EQA.)</p>
LO4	<p>4.1 The Learner is required to provide at least two examples of how procurement and supply operation activities contribute and are influenced by CSR.</p> <p>4.2 The Learner is required to reflect on how socially responsible procurement supply operation is monitored and reported within own organisation. They are required to reflect on at least two examples of monitoring and two examples of reporting activities and how they are improving CSR within their own organisation.</p>
